Moratorium on Deepwater Offshore Drilling in the Chukchi Sea Announced

In the wake of the largest oil spill in U.S. history, President Obama and Interior Secretary Ken Salazar took an important step toward preventing the next offshore oil disaster by announcing a moratorium on deepwater offshore drilling in the Chukchi Sea. Drilling activities there pose a serious threat to the sensitive ecosystems there that sustain polar bears, bowhead whales and other wildlife.

Ohio Farm Animal Ballot Initiative Gains Support

A large coalition of animal welfare advocates, veterinarians, family farmers and environmental organizations have joined forces to support a citizen-backed ballot initiative to help prevent cruel factory farming practices in the state of Ohio. Similar laws have already been enacted in Michigan, Arizona, California, Colorado, Florida, Maine and Oregon.

Mainstream Media Covers More Animal Issues

Several animal-related issues have appeared in mainstream media outlets lately – including shocking dairy farm and chick hatchery undercover video footage that aired on CNN, ABC, CBS, Fox affiliates, NBC and appeared in Slate magazine, an article titled, "Creating Chicken Without the Egg" in Time Magazine, and another article titled, "The Animal Cruelty Syndrome" appeared in the New York Times Magazine. A newly-released United Nations report condemns a meat-based diet and calls for a global shift away from animal products in our diets.

Peaceable Kingdom Wins Best of Fest Audience Award at Berkshire International Film Festival

Tribe of Heart's latest documentary, "Peaceable Kingdom: The Journey Home" recently won the Best of Fest Audience Award for documentary at the Berkshire International Film Festival. The film aired two times, followed by Q&A sessions with an engaged and inspired audience.

Take Action for Sea Turtles, Polar Bears and Other Wildlife

Loggerhead sea turtles were in trouble before the offshore Gulf oil disaster. The number of nesting females has declined by 50 percent in the past decade, leading the National Marine Fisheries Service to consider reclassifying loggerheads from threatened to endangered. But the ongoing Gulf oil disaster near their nesting grounds presents a new and deadly threat to these turtles. Exposure to oil can cause skin loss, poisoning, drowning and death. That is exactly why federal officials need every available tool to help save the lives of individual loggerheads and save this species from extinction.

Visit Defender of Wildlife's <u>action page</u> to send an urgent message to the National Marine Fisheries Service to list loggerhead sea turtles as endangered.

And through another <u>action page</u>, you can quickly contact your senator and urge Democrats to take a stand against Big Oil by supporting comprehensive climate legislation without dangerous new offshore drilling – to help protect polar bears, sea turtles, pelicans, lynx and thousands of other species.

Ask Senator to Support the Safe Chemicals Act of 2010 (\$ 3209)

Introduced by Sen. Frank Lautenberg (D-N.J.), The Safe Chemicals Act of 2010, S.3209, is designed to overhaul the 34-year-old Toxic Substances Control Act and tighten regulations on chemicals used in industrial and consumer goods. While the proposed Act incorporates long-overdue policy and scientific reforms recommended to reduce and replace the use of animals in chemical testing, it does not go far enough.

Tell Vivo Bio Tech to Stop Experimenting on Beagles and Monkeys

Vivo Bio Tech Ltd., an Indian biotechnology company, plans to build a \$140 million animal testing facility in Malaysia, where there are no laws to protect animals in laboratories.

The company then plans to ship beagles and monkeys to the laboratory for experiments. These animals would be condemned to lives of pain, loneliness, misery, and death, with no government oversight to monitor their use. These animals can be burned, cut open, shocked, poisoned, socially isolated, starved, dehydrated, forcibly restrained, addicted to drugs, brain-damaged, and more.

Urge Medical University of South Carolina to Stop Killing Pigs

A recent PETA investigation prompted the U.S. Department of Agriculture to cite laboratories at the Medical University of South Carolina (MUSC) for violations of federal animal welfare laws and revealed that MUSC continues to cut holes in the throats and chests of live pigs in a cruel and deadly trauma training exercise, even though the university has replaced animal use with a state-of-the-art TraumaMan simulator to teach *the very same skills* in its Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) course.

Comparative studies by leading trauma surgeons have repeatedly found that the use of TraumaMan—in addition to saving animals' lives—is superior to the use of animal labs for preparing trainees to treat injuries in human patients. TraumaMan and other simulators are endorsed by the American College of Surgeons and are used instead of animals in 95 percent of ATLS courses across the U.S.
